RECOGNIZING OUR BEREAVEMENT MINISTERS

Because of our belief not only in the immortality of the soul, but also in the resurrection of the body, the Church professes hope in the face of death, and acts with charity in the funeral rites. (USCCB Bereavement and Funerals)

Our parish's bereavement ministry assists those who are mourning the loss of a loved one by providing comfort, support and healing during their time of grief. Jesus taught in the Beatitudes, "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." Through this ministry, families are assisted with pastoral counseling through sudden or prolonged illness of their loved one. Sacraments of anointing the sick and the Eucharist are brought to the homebound. Funeral services and sacred burials are planned at the time of death and pre-need. Prayers, Masses, memorial services are arranged, and a welcoming atmosphere at Church is offered to those seeking solace in the love of God and the hope of everlasting life with Jesus Christ.

A beautiful All Souls Day evening Mass was celebrated on November 2nd with a special commemoration of over 40 souls who have passed in the last year and have held funeral rites with our parish (Nov. 1, 2022-Oct. 31, 2023). The 99 victims of the Maui wildfires were also remembered in the litany of the deceased. Over 30 families who lost their special someone this past year gathered to join together their prayer petitions in Mass asking for eternal rest and peace for their loved ones.

A YEAR OF THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

Personal Encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist

As the Church in the United States continues this time of Eucharistic Revival, we must give gratitude to God for such a purposeful time of encounter. In our own lives, we have experienced the graces of encountering the Eucharistic Lord, graces that have unfolded slowly and beautifully over the years. As we have gradually come to know and love the Lord through his silent presence in the Eucharist, we should be thrilled at the prospect of this intimate relationship with Jesus beginning anew in the lives of millions throughout our country. We can only imagine the love and joy he has waiting for those who draw close to Him.

What is most essential to understand about the Eucharist is that once the consecration has occurred at Mass, Christ is fully present, body, blood, soul and divinity, under the appearance of bread and wine. From there on he wants a personal encounter with us which has to be developed.

We begin another Liturgical year with the basics: What really is Mass; why do we have gestures of standing up, sitting down, kneeling during Mass; how and why do we genuflect before the Blessed Sacrament; why is reconciliation related to the worthy reception of Jesus in the Eucharist; what is adoration, and many more. In a culture as noisy and busy as ours, we have a reminder to maintain quiet and silence for adoration, deliberately mastering quiet stillness as an important tool in helping us be close to the Lord, for in silence the Lord speaks to us. The Eucharist reminds us that Jesus is at work, both around us and within us!

If you haven't encountered Christ in the Eucharist in a personal way yet, don't be afraid to ask him for this gift. Go before a monstrance or tabernacle where he is present and ask. He will not let you down.

ADVENT RETREAT, DEC 1-3

Imagine having the opportunity to start the new liturgical year in a peaceful and spiritual environment, recharging yourself with prayer, and connecting with God to start the season of Advent. All of this is possible, and it can make all the difference in the holiday season and into the new year. Greet the first weekend of Advent with expectant faith; the belief that God can be heard, seen, and felt in spiritual ways.

Located deep in the valley of the Koolau mountain range, Basic Christian Community of Hawaii (BCCH) offers a two-night Advent retreat for adult men and women led by spiritual directors, the Very Reverend Msgr. Gary Secor of the Diocese of Honolulu, and Sr. Meristella Umdor, a Missionary Sister of Mary Help of Christians. Retreatants come to enjoy the natural beauty of the peaceful location, and the freedom from modern distractions.

Since 1985, BCCH has welcomed guests to experience true Christian community, found in song, prayer, witness talks, educational and reflective experiences, and small faith-sharing groups. The theme of BCCH Adult Retreat #124 is "Jesus, My Lord and My Savior." This retreat is ideal for anyone seeking to find peace this holiday season in expectant faith for the celebration of God's gift to the world: the birth of Jesus Christ. 

This Year of Parish Revival is about falling deeper in love with the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus and following him more closely. Mirroring this internal journey with an external one is a beautiful way to connect body and soul in the pursuit of Christ.

The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage is not one event or a road trip—it is an exciting opportunity for American Catholics everywhere to physically embody our nation’s journey of Eucharistic Revival. Whether you are on the shores of Hawaii or in the mountains of Alaska, needing to stay close to home or deployed overseas, you are invited to be a part of this journey.

Shortly after his Resurrection, Jesus accompanied two disciples on their journey from Jerusalem to Emmaus—walking with them in their grief, offering hope, and finally revealing himself through the breaking of the bread. Jesus wants to do the same for YOU!

MAKE THE HONOLULU DIOCESE PILGRIMAGE

Following Jesus is a personal statement of faith—a faith that moves us to seek Our Lord wherever he goes: be it the streets, cathedrals, or in the hearts of the poor. The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will not only be undertaken by Perpetual Pilgrims (those who commit themselves to making the entire journey). All Catholics are invited to participate in this massive “Eucharistic Caravan.”

Make the Honolulu Diocese Pilgrimage a part of your experience of revival by planning a self-led personal pilgrimage in the next months leading up to the beginning of the Live Eucharistic Caravan in San Francisco.

The Diocese of Honolulu offers a Hawaii Eucharist Revival virtual pilgrimage called **Hawaii Pilgrim** at:

Sign up for a free Polarsteps account. Enter “Hawaii Pilgrim” on the Explore (Search people & places) tab. Click on “Follow” and begin your journey.

Use Hawaii Pilgrim to find church addresses, Mass, adoration and other regularly scheduled events when the church will be open.

CHOOSE A PILGRIMAGE DESTINATION AND TIME FRAME

- **WHERE:** Choose a church listed on Polarsteps Hawaii Pilgrim.
- **WHEN:** To make sure the site will be open when you intend to arrive, Plan your journey around the celebration of the Mass or Eucharistic adoration.
- **TRAVEL:** Decide how you will be traveling; walking, driving, by bike, etc. Make arrangements beforehand so that you can be fully present to your pilgrimage experience.

- **WITH WHOM:** Will you be traveling alone or with a community such as your family, parish, or youth group? Go in peace! The journey you are making is under the eye of the LORD.

YOUR INTENTIONS FOR THE PILGRIMAGE

- Pray for the special intentions that you and your loved ones have. You might also carry in your heart intentions for the Church, the world, or your local community. Be very specific and write them down. Jesus wants to bring healing, wholeness, and peace!

SPIRITUAL PREPARATION

- **PRAYER:** Invite family and friends to join you in prayer.
- **PATRON:** Pick a patron saint for your pilgrimage as your heavenly companion for the journey.

SETTING OUT/TRAVELING TO YOUR DESTINATION

- **PRAYER:** Make your pilgrimage a time of prayer and thanksgiving. Consider vocal prayers like the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, or reading from Scripture: Mark 14:22-24, John 6:35, John 6:51-57, Acts 2:42, 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, 1 Corinthians 11:23-28. 5.

ARRIVING AND PRAYING FOR YOUR INTENTIONS As you come to the threshold of your pilgrimage destination, do so with the knowledge that Jesus is waiting to encounter you in the Eucharist.

- **PRAYER:** Spend some time in silent adoration, thanking God for this pilgrimage and praying for your petitions. Pray individually and as a group.
- **LITURGY:** If possible, participate in Mass, offering the Mass for your petitions.

RETURNING/SHARING:

- Spend some quality time before you leave or on the way home sharing the graces of your experience with one another.
- If you are traveling on your own, journal about these graces or share them with a friend.
- Post a comment on the step where the church you visited is listed on Polarsteps.

- Encounter with Jesus leads to mission. Make an act of service or kindness to share in the saving mission of Jesus.

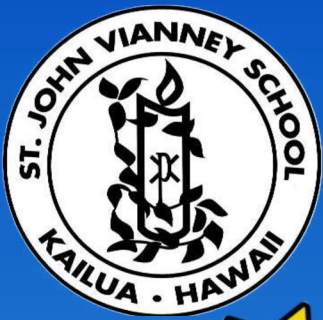

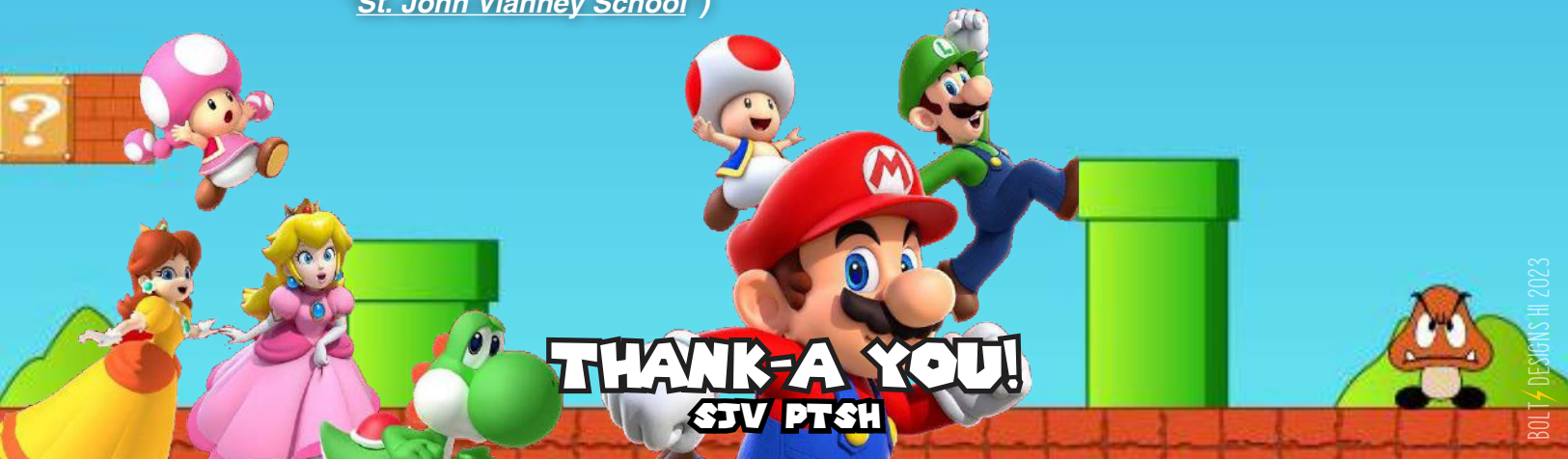
