CATHOLIC FAITH CORNER



A YEAR OF THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

What the Saints had to say about the Eucharist

One of the biggest differences between Catholics and most Protestants lies in our divergent understanding of the Eucharist. For the majority of Protestants, the Eucharist is just a memorial service; but Catholics believe that it is the real participation in Jesus’ sacrifice on the cross.

In the Old Testament, God foreshadowed the work of Christ in the Eucharist in many different ways. He did so through prophetic words and various mentioned signs of bread and wine.

A Few passages pointing to the fulfilment of the Eucharist:

Gen. 14:18 - This is the first time that the word “priest” is used in the Old Testament. Melchizedek is both a priest and a king and he offers bread and wine as a sacrifice to God.

Psalm 76:2 - Melchizedek is the king of Salem. Salem is the future Jerusalem where Jesus, eternal priest and king, established the Eucharistic sacrifice which He offered under the appearance of bread and wine.

Psalm 110:4 - This is the prophecy that Jesus will be the eternal priest and king in the same manner as this mysterious priest Melchizedek. This prophecy requires us to look for an eternal bread and wine as sacrifice in the future. This prophecy is fulfilled only by the Eucharistic sacrifice.

Malachi 1:11 - This is a prophecy of a pure offering that will be offered from the rising of the sun in every place. Thus, there will be only one sacrifice, but it will be offered in many and all places. This prophecy is fulfilled only by the Church’s sacrifice offered for our salvation. If this prophecy is not fulfilled by the Church, then Malachi is a false prophet.

In today’s Gospel , we hear Jesus tell us: “Whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple—Amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward.”

A thank you letter from Iven tells of the relief he felt when he was too ill to work, and a Vincentian returned his call for rental assistance. Unable to work or be self-sufficient was a new experience for him. He tried to remain positive and do what he could and trusted in God to work out the rest. 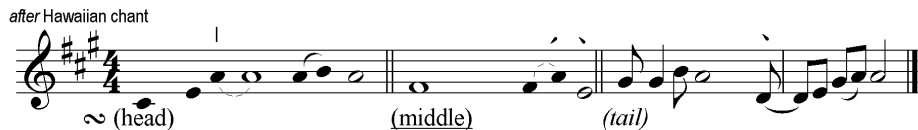

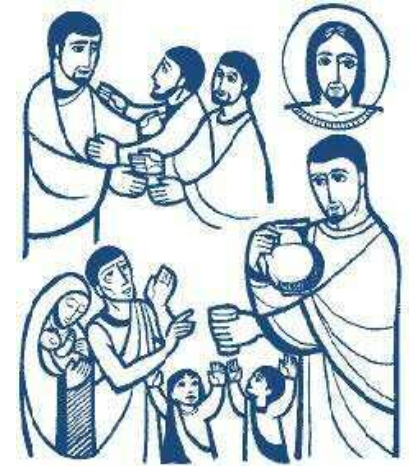

References to the Holy Eucharist In The Old Testament

*Passages written in scripture foreshadow
that Jesus is the Lamb of God and
that Bread and Wine would become
His Body and Blood.*

A year long focus to further educate our parish community and the Kailua community about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist



1. Bible scholars say that the Tree of Life in Genesis is a prefiguration of the Cross, and the fruit of the Tree of Life is a prefiguration of the Eucharist, the Body of Christ, which hung from the Cross.
2. Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; is said to foreshadow Christ's priesthood, who also offered bread and wine.
3. Isaac asks his father Abraham why there is a fire but no lamb for a burnt offering. Abraham responds: "God will provide himself the lamb for a burnt offering." Jesus is the "Lamb of God" offered in sacrifice for mankind. (**John 1:29**)
4. God commands Moses to say: "Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male...they shall take some of the blood and put it on the doorposts...They shall eat the flesh that night" (**Exodus 12: 5-8**). Jesus is identified with the Passover lamb, and the eating of the lamb with the eating of Jesus' body.
5. God also commands his people to eat "unleavened bread" (**Exodus 12:15**), According to Matthew and Mark, Jesus instituted the Eucharist on "the first day of Unleavened Bread" (**Matthew 26:17; Mark 14:12**).
6. God sent the Israelites the manna, or bread from heaven: Jesus is the fulfillment of the manna when he states " I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever" (**John 6: 49-51**).
7. Moses said, 'Behold the blood of the covenant which the Lord has made with you" (**Exodus 24:8**). Jesus said "This chalice which is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood" (**Luke 22:20**).
8. Moses said "You shall set the bread of the Presence on the table before me always" (**Exodus 25:30**). Jesus who is greater than the temple became the true bread of the Presence. (**Matthew 12:1-8**).
9. Todah is Hebrew for "thanksgiving. A todah sacrifice was a type of peace offering that consists of meat, bread and wine (**Lev 7:11-15; Num 15:8-10**). In the Eucharistic sacrifice, the bread and wine become the body and blood of Jesus.
10. Like a lamb that is led to the slaughter... although he had done no violence... he [made] himself an offering for sin." Jesus is, again, the "Lamb of God," who is the "righteous", and "the expiation for our sins" (**1 John 2:2**).

When Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022, a humanitarian crisis began for Ukrainians, whose lives were shattered by the violence of war. Many left their homes in eastern cities in Ukraine for cities in the west, such as Lviv, farther from the most intense fighting. He first visited the cities of Rivne and Zhovka and other regions directly affected by the early conflict. He returned to Ukraine to celebrate Mass in the cathedral in Lviv and to deliver an ambulance donated by the Holy Father to the Center for Mother and Child Health to assist children displaced by the war.

The Holy Father's charitable outreach to victims of war, migrants and refugees, and the poor affected by illness and natural disasters is supported by contributions to the Peter's Pence Collection. When you participate in the collection, you join Catholics across the globe in supporting the pope's mission of mercy as well as the activities of the Holy See's dicasteries that assist his ministry.

Support for such papal efforts is rooted in the scriptural message to take care of the poor and expresses unity with

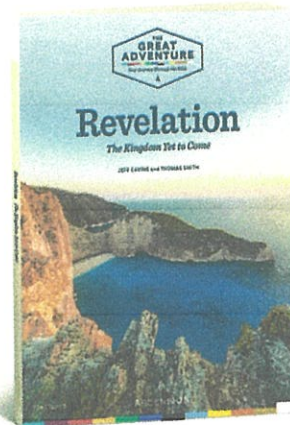

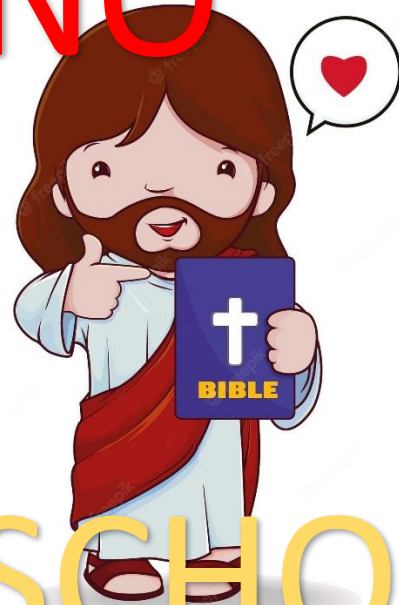
