"What happiness do we not feel in the Presence of God, when we are alone at his feet... Redouble your fervor; you are alone to adore your God; His eyes rest upon you alone."

"When Our Lord sees pure souls coming to visit him in the Blessed Sacrament he smiles on them. They come with the simplicity that pleases him so much."

"When we are before the Blessed Sacrament, instead of looking about us, let us shut our eyes and open our hearts; and the good God will open his. We will go to him, and he will come to us, the one to give, and the other to receive. It will be like a breath passing from one to the other. What delight we find in forgetting ourselves that we may seek God."

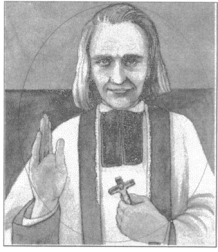

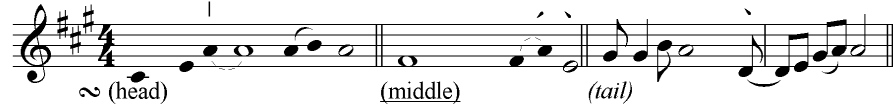

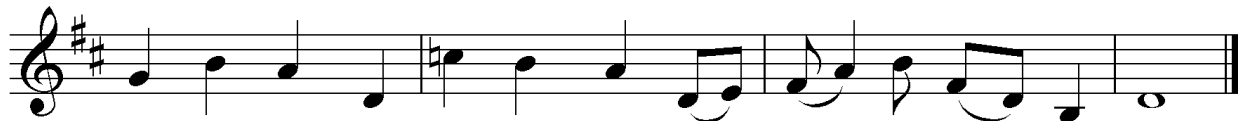

The Eucharistic Miracles Of the World

*Extraordinary signs of Jesus' presence in the Eucharist
have been recorded and venerated
since the earliest days of the Church up to the present.*

A year long focus to further educate our parish community and the Kailua community about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist



1. Around 750, the Miracle of Lanciano, Italy involved a priest who experienced doubts concerning Jesus' actual presence in the Eucharist. As he began to recite the words of consecration the wine and bread turned into real human blood and flesh. The flesh and blood remain preserved to this day in the Lanciano's Church of San Francesco.
2. In the year 1000 a non-Christian woman received Communion and took the consecrated Host from her mouth and placed it into a handkerchief. Wanting to learn whether or not it was just bread she put it into a heated frying pan filled with oil. Suddenly it spilled out masses of blood. The archbishop immediately ordered the return of the consecrated Host to the church. The relic of this miracle is housed in the Cathedral of Holy Mary of the Assumption in Trani, Italy.
3. On Easter Sunday, 1331 during Communion, the priest accidentally dropped a Host onto the cloth held under the chin of a person. When the priest tried to pick up the Host, he could not because the Host had turned into blood. This cloth is preserved today in the village of Blanot, France.
4. In the year 1400 during a Mass in Boxmeer, Holland the species of wine was transformed into blood and bubbled out of the chalice, splashing onto the altar cloth. As soon as the priest asked God to forgive his doubts, the blood stopped bubbling out of the chalice and coagulated into a lump the size of a walnut. Even today one can see the blood, which has not changed at all over time and is venerated to this day.
5. On December 8, 1991, a priest was celebrating Midnight Mass at the Shrine of Betania in Cúa, Venezuela. After the consecration the priest broke the consecrated Host into four pieces and one of the pieces began to bleed. This miraculous Host has been verified through tests that the substance is human blood type AB positive and can be seen today in the convent in Los Teques and the blood on the Host is still fresh, as it was when the miracle first occurred.
6. In 1996 in Buenos Aires a person receiving Communion dropped his Host. Another parishioner picked it up and gave it to the priest who placed it in a vessel with water to dissolve it. A week later the Host had not dissolved and was now showing reddish stains. A doctor, with no knowledge of its source, examined a sample and concluded it was cardiac tissue Myocardium from the left ventricle of one who could not breathe, and who labored and suffered much.
7. There are hundreds of other such miracles that have occurred over the centuries. These are just a few. Search the internet and read about many others.

Our Parish Faith Formation Committee encourages all parishioners to learn more about the Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist.

Dear Friends,

Peace be with you!

Jesus never experienced old age. He died at age 33. Though fully human like us, he never felt the disorientation of a fading memory, the aches and pains of arthritis, the dimming of his vision, the halting step, diminished strength, loss of hearing and stooped shoulders.

But no one had greater empathy for the widowed and infirm than Jesus. Indeed, his Jewish tradition elevated honoring father and mother to a commandment. And in fact, Jesus' very last instruction before he died, delivered from the cross, was one compelled by his concern for the elderly – his own mother. As recorded in the Gospel of John, "When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to her, 'Woman, here is your son,' and to the disciple, 'Here is your mother.'" The disciple was John.

Jesus went beyond merely asking John to "take care of" his mother. He declared them mother and son, a profound familial bond, with John taking Jesus' place as Mary's child, also suggesting that Jesus had been caring for his mother, most likely widowed by then, all along. "From that time on, this disciple took her into his home," the Gospel states.

Housing, security, protection, care, family. These also are the priorities of Catholic Charities Hawai'i in its commitment to Hawaii's seniors – our mothers, our Fathers, our grandmothers and grandfathers.

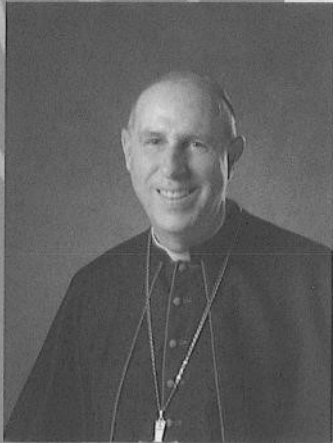
The theme for this year's Catholic Charities Sunday is "His mercy is from age to age," a truth declared by Mary in her Magnificat, and also the theme of Pope Francis' 2023 World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly.

In today's youth-oriented, ego-centric, throw-away culture, our elderly are too often dismissed, shoved aside, left alone, receiving less than adequate care, and no longer valued as contributors to society. Catholic Charities Hawai'i counters that attitude with its strong obligation to our kupuna, assisting them with housing, transportation, counseling, social activities, leisure, case management and more. But our seniors must not only be seen as recipients of services, but treasured as "teachers of tenderness," as Pope Francis put it, "so that their experience and wisdom may help young people to look toward the future with hope and responsibility."

Our kupuna are precious. And deserving. Please be generous this Catholic Charities Hawai'i Sunday to support them – and all the other sisters and brothers served by Catholic Charities Hawai'i. Your wonderful support in the past is deeply appreciated!

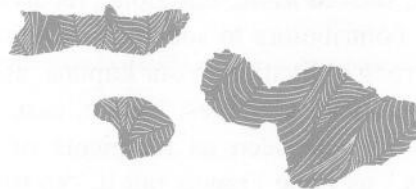
