## Invite "Lapsed Catholics" Campaign

During this month of September, we will take a look at noticing that there are many of our brothers and sisters who have abandoned their faith. It is part of our mission to invite them back. It is said that they are the second largest body of believers in the country. They most probably outnumber all of the mainline Protestant churches combined. At any given moment, there are nearly 20 million of them. Who are they? They are the **Lapsed Catholics**.

We all know inactive Catholics: an uncle who has not been to Mass in decades because he 'hates' the new liturgy; a sister who left because she is 'mad' at God after the death of her husband; a friend who left after professors persuaded her that the Church is misogynist because women are not ordained. They were once active in parishes. They were baptized; many were confirmed, and others were married in the Church. And then they were gone. They ceased sharing the faith with their Catholic friends and family, and, worst of all, they ceased partaking of the sacraments.

The question facing all of us, being asked by many Catholics today is: How do we get them back? What would it take for the Church in this country to bring back its millions of lost sheep? Perhaps we are the courageous friend being sent to invite them back.

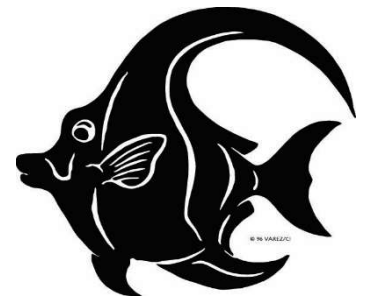

# **The Year of Mission**

## **Welcome Someone Back.**

- Don't be shy to reach-out and invite a non-practicing/inactive Catholic to return Home to the Catholic Church and resume active practice of their faith.
- Ask Jesus to guide you and invite the Holy Spirit into your conversation with them. God knows exactly what this person needs to hear and will speak through you.
- Let them know you have missed them at church and that they have an important place in our parish family and that they are always welcome back.
- Inquire as to the reasons they have stopped attending Mass. Be sure to let them know that whatever the reason, you and our parish family are here to support them.
- Prepare for objections they may raise, but never argue or get defensive. Tell them that they are not alone and to not be afraid to find answers to their questions and concerns through our parish priest and community.
- Regardless of why they left or got out of the habit of going to Mass, let them know they can always come home to the practice of the sacraments and the fullness of a relationship with Jesus Christ and the Church he founded.
- Invite them to come with you to Mass not only at Christmas and Easter, but also for celebratory dates like birthdays, anniversaries, graduations or other milestones. Include a meal afterwards if needed to entice them.
- Offer to bring them to one of our parish events, such as Breakfast with the Bishop, Mardi Gras, Trunk or Treat, or Advent Wreath Making to help them return to the church.
- The most persuasive way to bring others back is our own personal belief in the beauty and wonder of the Mass and how it supports your relationship with God. Let your love for the Mass be contagious!
- Learn as much as possible about the Mass and the reasons we Catholics do the things we do. Be prepared to state what we personally know to be the truth.
- Share motivational websites on the Internet such as [catholicscomehome.org](http://catholicscomehome.org). There are also many video presentations on the Mass that can be shared on sites like YouTube and Facebook.
