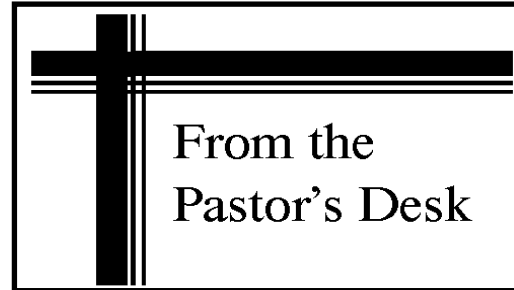

DEAR PARISH FAMILY,

Last Sunday we heard the call of Samuel and also of two disciples, and we considered the nature of God's call and how he calls each one of us by name. Today, we again look at Jesus calling four individuals to discipleship and see how they responded to that call. He called Simon and Andrew, then James and John: ***"Follow me and I will make you fishers of people."*** Once they heard the call, Peter and Andrew left their nets (*the means of their livelihood*) and followed after Jesus. James and John, likewise, leaving their father Zebedee and his hired men, followed him. Their response teaches us about the dimensions of every Christian life. The Lord called them for a purpose, just like he calls each of us for a reason. The call of the Lord in Baptism is not just generic but very personal.

When you think about it, it was a complete act of trust and a total surrender of themselves. To what? Actually, they had no idea where they were going. They had no idea of what the future held. This was the extent of their great trust in this man who came out of the blue into their lives and challenged them to leave behind their security and throw in their lot with Him. They would, in fact, go through many unexpected experiences, some of them joyful, some of them full of pain. But they never regretted that day they walked away from their security. They found experiences that transcended all their dreams.

The call is still going out to each one of us. Am I ready to answer and to follow? What are my nets that are limiting my freedom to follow him? What personal relationships are blocking my way? What anxieties? What self-centered ambitions? Cheer up, respond as the disciples did and say YES!

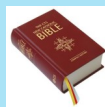

Apologetics Without Apology



Year of Reading the Bible

**Jonah 3:1-5, 10; 1 Corinthians 7:29-31;
Mark 1: 14-20.**

Written in the period after the exile to Babylon, the Book of Jonah is a prophecy to the Jews returning home. Ancient prophecies were intended to call God's people back to faithfulness. So it is not unusual that Jonah would be directed to pronounce doom on Nineveh, capital of Assyria. That nation had conquered the northern kingdom of Israel in an earlier period of Israel's history, 722 years before the birth of Christ. The Book of Jonah is unusual, however, because when called to repentance, they believed Jonah and repented. No prophet to the Jews had such instantaneous success. While the Ninevites were a sworn enemy of Israel, they willingly and miraculously changed their ways. And God refrained from exerting the punishment that was intended.

Questions from the text: How does this story prophesy to the Jews after the exile and bring them back to faithfulness? How does it prophesy to us?

The Gospel: In the Gospel, as Jesus begins his public ministry he calls people to follow him.

Jesus always made a point of meeting and calling people wherever he found them. He met and called Matthew the tax collector when he was counting his money. He called people not when they were on their knees praying in the temple or the synagogue, but while they were busy at their trade. The important thing to remember and realize is that Jesus never stops calling us by our name. Today we are the ones who are not only called, we are also sent out to proclaim the gospel through how we live; through what we say and what we do.

Other references about being called: Isaiah 65:1; John 15:16; Romans 8:28; 1 Peter 1:15-16.

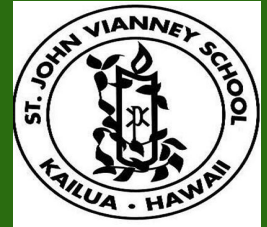

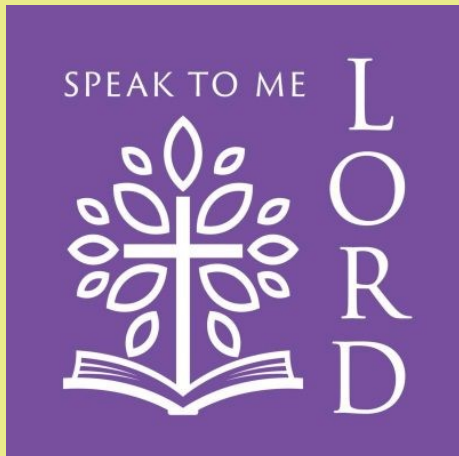


Offertory: Our weekly donation for **January 16th to January 22nd, 2021** is **\$8,779** and the weekly **budget is \$8,010**.

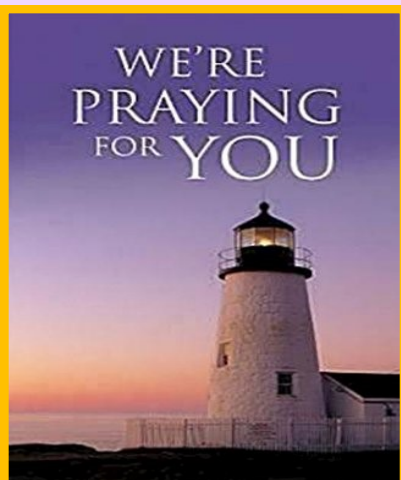

Jon 3:1-5, 10
