What Prophets had to say about the Eucharist

Jesus introduced the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist. It did not exist during the days of the Old Testament. However, our Father in heaven gradually prepared us to receive it. These Old Testament accounts describe pre-figurations of the Holy Eucharist.

Abel: The earliest shadow of the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood was Abel, the younger son of Adam and Eve. Cain murdered the good shepherd, Abel. In Genesis 4:10, the Lord told Cain: "The voice of your brother's blood cries out to Me from the ground." In the Book of Hebrews 12:24, we are reminded that "... [Christ's] sprinkled Blood that speaks more graciously than the blood of

The Harvest: In ancient Israel, the Spring harvest consisted of grain or wheat. Bread has long been the symbol of the Spring harvest. The Autumn harvest was mostly grapes. Out of these came bread and wine, elements used for the celebration of the sacrifice of the altar.

Melchizedek: In Genesis 14:18 we are told of Melchizedek who pre -figured Christ. When Abram returned from his victory over Chedorlaomer, "Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was priest of God Most High ..." to bless Abram, prefiguring the bread and wine consecrated by a priest at Mass. In the Book of Hebrews 7:2, we are told: "Melchizedek is first, by translation of his name, king of righteousness, and then he is also king of Salem (shalom), that is, king of peace. He is without father or mother or genealogy, and has neither beginning nor end of life, but resembling the Son of God he remains a priest forever."






To renew us by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.



References to the Holy Eucharist In The Old Testament

Passages written in scripture foreshadow that Jesus is the Lamb of God and that Bread and Wine would become His Body and Blood. A year long focus to further educate our parish community and the Kailua community about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist

- Bible scholars say that the Tree of Life in Genesis is a prefiguration of the Cross, and the fruit of the Tree of Life is a prefiguration of the Eucharist, the Body of Christ, which hung from the Cross.
- 2. Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; is said to foreshadow Christ's priesthood, who also offered bread and wine.



- 3. Isaac asks his father Abraham why there is a fire but no lamb for a burnt offering. Abraham responds: "God will provide himself the lamb for a burnt offering." Jesus is the "Lamb of God" offered in sacrifice for mankind. (John 1:29)
- 4. God commands Moses to say: "Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male...they shall take some of the blood and put it on the doorposts...They shall eat the flesh that night" (**Exodus 12: 5-8**). Jesus is identified with the Passover lamb, and the eating of the lamb with the eating of Jesus' body.
- 5. God also commands his people to eat "unleavened bread" (Exodus 12:15), According to Matthew and Mark, Jesus instituted the Eucharist on "the first day of Unleavened Bread" (Matthew 26:17; Mark 14:12).
- 6. God sent the Israelites the manna, or bread from heaven: Jesus is the fulfillment of the manna when he states "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever" (John 6: 49-51).
- 7. Moses said, 'Behold the blood of the covenant which the Lord has made with you" (Exodus 24:8). Jesus said "This chalice which is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood" (Luke 22:20).
- 8. Moses said "You shall set the bread of the Presence on the table before me always" (Exodus 25:30). Jesus who is greater than the temple became the true bread of the Presence. (Matthew 12:1-8).
- 9. Todah is Hebrew for "thanksgiving. A todah sacrifice was a type of peace offering that consists of meat, bread and wine (**Lev 7:11-15; Num 15:8-10).** In the Eucharistic sacrifice, the bread and wine become the body and blood of Jesus.
- 10.Like a lamb that is led to the slaughter... although he had done no violence... he [made] himself an offering for sin." Jesus is, again, the "Lamb of God," who is the "righteous", and "the expiation for our sins" (1 John 2:2).

Our Parish Faith Formation Committee encourages all parishioners to learn more about the Real Presence during the next 12 months.

Deacon Larry Oney and his wife minister in the Archdiocese of New Orleans. Deacon Oney is the founder and president of Hope and Purpose Ministries in Louisiana, which he created in part to provide mentorship through the creation and distribution of Catholic materials in all forms of media. **Andi**Oney, international evangelist and author, previously served in education for 12 years. In 2013 her life changed while attending an International Prophetic Consultation gathering of leaders in Bethlehem, Israel. While in Israel, she experienced a dramatic conversion as she prayed in the Upper Room in Jerusalem, believed to be the site of the Last Supper and Pentecost.

Evangelist **Kathleen Beckman**, a popular presenter on topics including the spiritual life, Eucharistic life, healing and deliverance ministry, Divine Mercy, Mary, and the spirituality of Blessed Conchita Cabrera. She is author of four best-selling books, "Praying for Priests", "God's Healing Mercy", "When Women Pray", and "A Family Guide to Spiritual Warfare". For twenty-five years, and in thirteen countries, through Catholic radio and television, writing and speaking, she has served in the Church's ministry of evangelization.

Monsignor Stephen Doktorczyk, JCD is a priest of the Diocese of Orange, California, a canon lawyer, and Co-founder and Spiritual Director of the Foundation of Prayer for Priests. Prior to ordination in 2005, he worked in the grocery business and human resources. He has a Master of Business Administration from California State University, Long Beach, a Bachelor's degree in Sacred Theology, and Doctorate in Canon Law. He has also served as Adjutant Judicial Vicar, and Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia.


