A YEAR OF THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



What Prophets had to say about the Eucharist

Last week we saw how the prophet Isaiah described the lamb that was handed to the priest to complete the sacrifice. This Sunday we continue on as to how this sacrifice would be completed.

Before the great tabernacle sacrifice, Jewish priests washed their hands in a bronze laver, or basin. In Psalm 26:6, we are reminded: "I wash my hands in innocence, and go about Thy altar, O Lord." Today the Catholic priest washes his hands saying inaudibly, Psalm 51:2: "Lord, wash away my iniquity; cleanse me from my sin."

“To complete the sacrifice, the head of the household then cuts the lamb's throat with a sharp bronze knife, while the priest catches the lamb's blood in a large bronze bowl. The priest then makes seven complete trips around the altar, sprinkling the blood from the lamb on each of the four "horns." Then he takes the lamb's body and places it on the altar and starts the ritual fire. With a big fire and a small lamb, the sacrifice is over quickly. The smoke rises from the altar. If the wind blows the smoke away and disperses it, the priest tells the family that its offer was rejected, and that they should repent and come back the following year. But if the smoke drifts upward, higher and higher until it disappears from view, the priest tells the family that God has accepted the sacrifice.”

Prayer to St. John Vianney

St. John Vianney, we thank you for the gift of this beautiful church in your name. We strive to capture the spirit of loving service to all in our community.

We pray that we will be faithful stewards of the resources of our parish, and ask for your blessing upon our efforts. With our hearts, talents and treasures, we strive to strengthen our parish and bring the Gospel of Jesus to our community.

As a prayerful people, we wish to build upon the foundation of the faithful who came before us and bless the generations to come. Help us to fulfil these goals

St. John Vianney, pray for our priests, pray for us, and pray for the mission of our parish. Amen

Patron Saint of all parish priests

St. John Mary Vianney was ordained a priest in 1815. Three years later he was made the parish priest of Ars, a remote French hamlet, not very far from the town of Lyons. Within a short time his reputation as a confessor and director of souls became well known. People began coming to him from other parishes, then from nearby villages, then from all parts of France, and finally from other countries.

The most distinguished persons visited the village of Ars for the purpose of seeing the holy curé and hearing his daily instruction. His instructions were simple in language, full of imagery drawn from daily life and country scenes. His direction was characterized by common sense, remarkable insight, and supernatural knowledge. It is recorded that even the staunchest of sinners were converted at his mere word. His advice was sought by bishops, priests, religious, young men and women in doubt as to their vocation, sinners, persons in all sorts of difficulties and the sick. By 1855, the number of pilgrims is estimated to have reached twenty thousand a year.

During the last ten years of his life, he spent from sixteen to eighteen hours a day in the confessional. His life was filled with works of charity and love. Although he was a wonderworker loved by the crowds, he retained a childlike simplicity throughout his life. He labored incessantly, with unflinching humility, gentleness, patience, and cheerfulness, until he was more than seventy-three years old.

He died August 4, 1859 and on October 3, 1874 Pope Pius IX proclaimed him Venerable; on January 8, 1905, Pope Pius X declared him Blessed and proposed him as a model to the parochial clergy; in 1925 Pope Pius XI canonized him. In 1929 he was made patron saint of all parish priests.

At a young age, you were seen kneeling in the front of the statue of Mary. Your soul was supernaturally carried towards the things on High. Despite the high cost, you answered your vocation! Against many obstacles and contradictions, you had to fight and suffer to become the perfect priest which you were. But your deep spirit of faith supported you in all these battles.

Responsory: O Great Saint you know the desire of my soul; I would like to serve God better; from Him I have received so many good things. For this, obtain for me more courage and especially the depth of faith. Many of my thoughts, words, and actions are useless for my sanctification and for my salvation, because this supernatural spirit does not stir up my life. Help me to be better in the future.

Holy Priest of Ars, I have confidence in your intercession. Pray for me during this novena especially for ... (mention silently your special intentions).

And you, O good Saint, gave them hope by your words, which were full of love for God

Responsory: You, who had always counted entirely on the heart of God, obtain for me a deep filial trust in His Providence. As the hope of divine good fills my heart, give me courage and help me to always obey the Commandments of God. Holy Priest of Ars, I have confidence in your intercession. Pray for me during this novena especially for ... (mention silently your special intentions).

(leader: In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit) All: Amen.

LEADER: Saint John Marie Baptist Vianney because of your love of God you showed great charity towards your neighbor. You could not preach on the Love of God without burning tears of love. During your last years, it seemed as though you could not talk about anything else or live for anything else. Thus you sacrificed yourself to your neighbor by consoling, absolving and sanctifying them to the limits of your strength.

Responsory: Your charity inspires me to greater love of God, a love which is shown more by acts than by words. Help me to love my neighbor generously as Christ loves them. Holy Priest of Ars, I have confidence in your intercession. Pray for me during this novena especially for ... (mention silently your special intentions).

(Together all say:) **Our Father..... | Hail Mary,..... | Glory be.....**
(leader: In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit) All: Amen.

DAY FOUR (July 30, Sunday) *(Start with the Opening Prayer to Saint John Vianney)*

LEADER: Saint John Mary Baptist Vianney, you were so adamant against sin, yet so sympathetic and so ready to welcome the sinner. I come to you today as if you were still alive, as if I were kneeling at your feet and you could hear me. Bend towards me, listen to the repentant confidence for the weaknesses and miserable deeds of mine.

Responsory: Priest of the Lord, inexhaustible Confessor, obtain for me the horror for sin. You wanted us first to avoid the occasion of sin. I want to take your advice and make the resolution to break bad habits and to avoid the dangerous occasions of sin. Help me today to examine my conscience. Holy Priest of Ars, I have confidence in your intercession. Pray for me during this novena especially for... (mention silently your special intentions).

(Together all say:) **Our Father..... | Hail Mary,..... | Glory be.....**
(leader: In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit) All: Amen.

LEADER: O Holy Priest of Ars, you knew how important was a good confession for the Christian life. It was to procure the happy fruits of millions of souls that you agreed to be in an uncomfortable confessional, which was like a prison, up to 15 to 16 hours on certain days.

Responsory: I will try to develop the habit of frequent confession, to prepare properly each time and to have always regret for my sins, so that the grace of final perseverance but also the sanctification of my soul will be assured. Ask this grace for me. Holy Priest of Ars, I have confidence in your intercession. Pray for me during this novena especially for ... (mention silently your special intentions).

(leader: In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit) All: Amen.

DAY SIX (August 1, Tuesday) *(Start with the Opening Prayer to Saint John Vianney)*

LEADER: O Holy Priest of Ars, whose only comfort in this world was the real presence of Jesus in the tabernacle, was it not your great joy to distribute the Eucharist to the pilgrims who visited you? You refused Communion to the souls who refused to reform but to souls of goodwill you opened wide the doors of the Eucharistic Feast.

Responsory: You, who each day at Holy Mass received Holy Communion with great loves, give me some of your fervor. With freedom from mortal sin, obtain for me a sincere desire to profit from receiving Holy Communion. Holy Priest of Ars, I have confidence in your intercession. Pray for me during this novena especially for... (mention silently your special intentions).

(leader: In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit) All: Amen.

LEADER: O Holy Priest of Ars, the infamous attacks of the devil which you had to suffer and the trials which disheartened you by fatigue would not make you give up the sublime task of converting souls. The devil came to you for many years to disturb your short rest but you won because of mortification and prayers.

Responsory: Powerful protector, you know the temptor's desire to harm my baptized and believing soul. He would have me sin, by rejecting the Holy Sacraments and the life of virtue. But good Saint of Ars dispel from me the traces of the enemy. Holy Priest of Ars, I have confidence in your intercession. Pray for me during this novena especially for ... (mention silently your special intentions).

(leader: In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit) **All: Amen.**

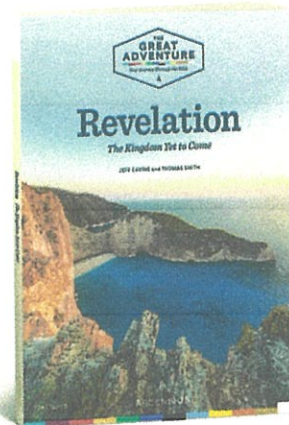

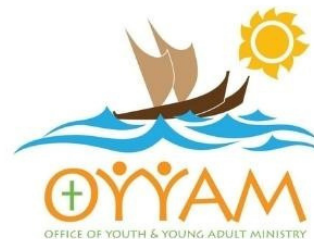
