A YEAR OF THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

What Prophets had to say about the Eucharist



As we conclude on what the prophets had to say about the Eucharist, we saw how all sacrificial elements pointed to what would happen in the bloodless sacrifice of the altar in the Eucharist.

The Exodus: After the Passover, with its pre-figuration of Calvary, the Israelite people began their long exodus from the land of Egypt to the promised land of Canaan. God told Moses, Ex 16:4 "I will rain bread from heaven for you; and the people shall go out and gather a day's portion every day, that I may prove them, whether they will walk in my law or not." Moses told the Israelites, Ex 16:8 "When the Lord gives you in the evening flesh and in the morning bread to the full..." The "bread from heaven" reminds us of Christ's words, Jn 6:49 "Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness and they died. This is the bread which comes down from heaven, that a man may eat of it and not die." The "evening flesh" reminds us of Christ's sacrifice. Mt 27:45, 50 "Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour. ... And Jesus cried again with a loud voice and yielded up his spirit." The "morning bread" reminds us of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

The Israelites gathered up the manna, Ex 16:17 "...some more, some less. But when they measured it, he that gathered much had nothing over, and he that gathered little had no lack; each gathered according to what he could eat." This reminds us of the Miracle of the Loaves and Fishes, Mt 15:37 "And they all ate and were satisfied." That miracle pre-figured the Holy Eucharist, from which the smallest piece is a full portion of Christ's Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, and which can never run out because Jesus said He would be with us until the end of time.

What to do when asked to present the gifts at Mass

The preparation of the gifts occurs during a time of transition in the Mass. After being nourished by the words of sacred Scripture in the Liturgy of the Word, the faithful prepare to be fed through the Holy Eucharist. The people taking up the gifts represent the people of the parish and the entire Church. They bring up bread, wine, and the collection, as signs of the gifts God has given us and are returned back to him. These gifts will be transformed through the mystery of transubstantiation into the real body and blood of Christ. Gift bearers will move toward the gift table at the back of church after the close of the Prayer of the Faithful. When the priest and altar servers have moved in front of the altar, the gifts may be brought up reverently. After handing over the gifts, it is customary for gift bearers to bow to the altar before returning to their pew.

Prayer to St. John Vianney

St. John Vianney, we thank you for the gift of this beautiful church in your name. We strive to capture the spirit of loving service to all in our community.

We pray that we will be faithful stewards of the resources of our parish, and ask for your blessing upon our efforts. With our hearts, talents and treasures, we strive to strengthen our parish and bring the Gospel of Jesus to our community.

Patron Saint of all parish priests

St. John Mary Vianney was ordained a priest in 1815. Three years later he was made the parish priest of Ars, a remote French hamlet, not very far from the town of Lyons. Within a short time his reputation as a confessor and director of souls became well known. People began coming to him from other parishes, then from nearby villages, then from all parts of France, and finally from other countries.

The most distinguished persons visited the village of Ars for the purpose of seeing the holy curé and hearing his daily instruction. His instructions were simple in language, full of imagery drawn from daily life and country scenes. His direction was characterized by common sense, remarkable insight, and supernatural knowledge. It is recorded that even the staunchest of sinners were converted at his mere word. His advice was sought by bishops, priests, religious, young men and women in doubt as to their vocation, sinners, persons in all sorts of difficulties and the sick. By 1855, the number of pilgrims is estimated to have reached twenty thousand a year.

During the last ten years of his life, he spent from sixteen to eighteen hours a day in the confessional. His life was filled with works of charity and love. Although he was a wonderworker loved by the crowds, he retained a childlike simplicity throughout his life. He labored incessantly, with unflinching humility, gentleness, patience, and cheerfulness, until he was more than seventy-three years old.

He died August 4, 1859 and on October 3, 1874 Pope Pius IX proclaimed him Venerable; on January 8, 1905, Pope Pius X declared him Blessed and proposed him as a model to the parochial clergy; in 1925 Pope Pius XI canonized him. In 1929 he was made patron saint of all parish priests.

Dear Friends,

Peace be with you!

Jesus never experienced old age. He died at age 33. Though fully human like us, he never felt the disorientation of a fading memory, the aches and pains of arthritis, the dimming of his vision, the halting step, diminished strength, loss of hearing and stooped shoulders.

But no one had greater empathy for the widowed and infirm than Jesus. Indeed, his Jewish tradition elevated honoring father and mother to a commandment. And in fact, Jesus' very last instruction before he died, delivered from the cross, was one compelled by his concern for the elderly – his own mother. As recorded in the Gospel of John, "When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to her, 'Woman, here is your son,' and to the disciple, 'Here is your mother.'" The disciple was John.

Jesus went beyond merely asking John to "take care of" his mother. He declared them mother and son, a profound familial bond, with John taking Jesus' place as Mary's child, also suggesting that Jesus had been caring for his mother, most likely widowed by then, all along. "From that time on, this disciple took her into his home," the Gospel states.

Housing, security, protection, care, family. These also are the priorities of Catholic Charities Hawai'i in its commitment to Hawaii's seniors – our mothers, our Fathers, our grandmothers and grandfathers.

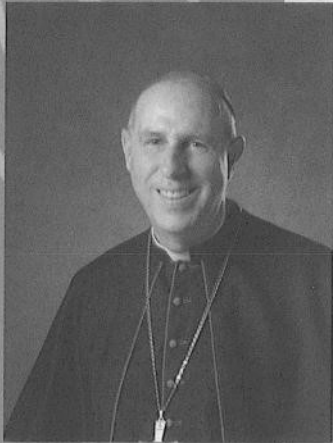
The theme for this year's Catholic Charities Sunday is "His mercy is from age to age," a truth declared by Mary in her Magnificat, and also the theme of Pope Francis' 2023 World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly.

In today's youth-oriented, ego-centric, throw-away culture, our elderly are too often dismissed, shoved aside, left alone, receiving less than adequate care, and no longer valued as contributors to society. Catholic Charities Hawai'i counters that attitude with its strong obligation to our kupuna, assisting them with housing, transportation, counseling, social activities, leisure, case management and more. But our seniors must not only be seen as recipients of services, but treasured as "teachers of tenderness," as Pope Francis put it, "so that their experience and wisdom may help young people to look toward the future with hope and responsibility."

Our kupuna are precious. And deserving. Please be generous this Catholic Charities Hawai'i Sunday to support them – and all the other sisters and brothers served by Catholic Charities Hawai'i. Your wonderful support in the past is deeply appreciated!

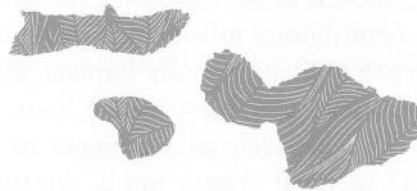
