A YEAR OF THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

Personal Encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist

First Holy Communion: It is and has always been true that pastors, parents and catechists have a critical role in helping children understand the significance of receiving the Eucharist. While children certainly aren't expected to grasp the philosophical and theological underpinnings of the sacrament, they can be led to appreciate the joy of meeting the Lord Jesus, their Savior and Friend, in the Eucharist. It is important that adults understand and therefore teach the children what they receive in the Eucharist. We commend all those in the Church who share in this Eucharistic catechesis.

First Holy Communion, like many sacramental moments in the Church, is accompanied by popular customs that heighten the experience of the moment. It's common for children to wear beautiful new white dresses or suits, to receive special gifts – prayer books, rosaries and scapulars – and to have family gatherings or parties to mark the occasion. While all of these things are fine in moderation, it is important to celebrate with “solemnness.”

It's important to emphasize that the catechesis for the proper reception of Holy Communion extends beyond the first time a child receives, and that every time we attend Mass, we teach our children something about the meaning of the Eucharist. And keep in mind that we teach children about the Holy Mass and the Eucharist far more by what we do, rather than by what we say.

Eucharistic Revival Pilgrimage 2024

Thousands followed Christ throughout his earthly ministry. Since his Resurrection, countless Christians have traveled to holy sites in order to connect concretely with places where heaven and earth have touched.

A pilgrimage is “the simultaneous movement of the feet and the soul”—a journey made both externally and internally. The pilgrim travels to a location of spiritual significance, stepping outside of themselves in order to encounter God in places where he has revealed himself. This action mirrors the interior journey of the pilgrim, who uses this experience to draw closer to Our Lord and seek him more intentionally. The value of a pilgrimage is not in the distance traveled but in the disposition of our own hearts and the zeal with which we seek God. Many saints have had life-changing experiences while on pilgrimage, and the practice has been a part of Christianity from the beginning.

Throughout the National Eucharistic Revival, local communities are gathering tinder in response to God's invitation for renewal, calling on the Holy Spirit to bring the flame. In keeping with this vision, the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will accompany Jesus from city to city, lighting hearts on fire along the way. Then, at the National Eucharistic Congress in July 2024, all these flames will blaze together.

While pilgrimages have a long legacy within the Church, this is the first undertaken at such a scale—walking coast-to-coast with Our Eucharistic Lord! Visit www.eucharisticpilgrimage.org to find out more about this tradition and the fruits of making a pilgrimage yourself.

- ◆ Equip and prepare dioceses to foster the four pillars of the Revival in the upcoming Year of Parish Revival: Reinvigorating Worship, Personal Encounters, Robust Formation, and Missionary Sending
- ◆ Stir engaged Catholics to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist

Every parish in the country will experience profound renewal while participating in grassroots efforts inspired by the four pillars of the Revival. Parishes will be equipped with simple, proven tools to invite their community into the following:

REINVIGORATED WORSHIP

- ◆ Renew the emphasis on the celebration of the liturgy

- ◆ Host monthly Encounter Nights, featuring Eucharistic adoration and the Sacrament of Confession

ROBUST FORMATION

- ◆ Implement the “Jesus and the Eucharist” small group initiative

SEND MISSIONARIES

- ◆ Bring lapsed brothers and sisters home with the “Invite One Back” campaign
- ◆ Recommit to serving the poor in your community in a new way

Eucharistic Mini-Pilgrimage Guide



Go in peace! The journey you are making is under the eye of the LORD.

JUDGES 18:6

1. CHOOSE A PILGRIMAGE DESTINATION AND TIME FRAME

WHERE: Choose a holy site that will help you grow closer to Jesus in the Eucharist. This could be a church, shrine, or monastery. See if your diocese has a list of local pilgrimage sites.

WHEN: Make sure the site will be open when you intend to arrive. Plan your journey around the celebration of the Mass or Eucharistic adoration.

TRAVEL: Decide how you will be traveling—walking, driving, by train, etc. Make arrangements beforehand so that you can be fully present to your pilgrimage experience.

WITH WHOM: Will you be traveling alone or with a community such as your family, parish, or youth group?

2. YOUR INTENTIONS FOR THE PILGRIMAGE

Pray for the special intentions that you and your loved ones have. You might also carry in your heart intentions for the Church, the world, or your local community. Be very specific and write them down. Jesus wants to bring healing, wholeness, and peace!

3. SPIRITUAL PREPARATION

PRAYER: Invite family and friends to join you in prayer.

PATRON: Pick a patron saint for your pilgrimage as your heavenly companion for the journey.

4. SETTING OUT/TRAVELING TO YOUR DESTINATION

PRAYER: Make your pilgrimage a time of prayer and thanksgiving. Consider vocal prayers like the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, or reading from Scripture: Mark 14:22-24, John 6:35, John 6:51-57, Acts 2:42, 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, 1 Corinthians 11:23-28.

5. ARRIVING AND PRAYING FOR YOUR INTENTIONS

As you come to the threshold of your pilgrimage destination, do so with the knowledge that Jesus is waiting to encounter you in the Eucharist.

PRAYER: Spend some time in silent adoration, thanking God for this pilgrimage and praying for your petitions. Pray individually and as a group.

LITURGY: If possible, participate in Mass, offering the Mass for your petitions.

6. RETURNING

SHARING: Spend some quality time before you leave or on the way home sharing the graces of your experience with one another. If you are traveling on your own, journal about these graces or share them with a friend.

7. POST-PILGRIMAGE

After your pilgrimage, pray about how the experience changed you. Ask Jesus to show you how he wants to be more present in your life through this pilgrimage.

If you carried the intentions of others, share something about what the pilgrimage meant for you with them.

Encounter with Jesus leads to mission. Make an act of service or kindness to share in the saving mission of Jesus.

A Eucharistic pilgrimage is a testimony to the world that Jesus is alive in the Eucharist, and he accompanies us—all of us—on our pilgrimage through life.
