## CATHOLIC FAITH CORNER



#### A YEAR OF EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

Renew worshipping at Mass to encounter Jesus in a personal way.

Last Sunday we saw that while the Holy Mass is the high point of the week, our Eucharistic communion should extend beyond that one hour on Sunday. Just as Jesus waits for us on Sunday, calling us to communion with him at Mass, so he also invites us to visit him during the week. The practice of adoration follows naturally from intimacy with Jesus in communion. When we grow in friendship and love with him, we seek him out to spend more time with him. The Church reserves the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist in the tabernacle of the church precisely for this reason; as a place of refuge where we can find Jesus at any time. Adoration helps us to recognize God's presence and greatness and our great need for him, that teaches us always to rely on him. Adoration, in this sense, is a continual disposition of honor and respect toward Jesus, one that leads us to seek him out in order to spend time with him. This time opens the door to Jesus's lordship over our lives. It becomes the stability of our lives that sustains us each day and helps us to take up our crosses.

By simply making a visit to Jesus in church or in adoration each day or each week, a transformation can/will occur in us. Attending Mass and coming to adoration gives Jesus more time to act in our souls, to bless us, and give renewed life to our family, our parish and to the Church through us. Silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament will transform our lives and bring about many graces.







# Strengthen our worship at Mass to encounter Jesus in the Eucharist

- The Mass is the central action and aspect of our lives of faith and the primary way in which we Catholics worship God as a community. Mass offers a unique opportunity to encounter Jesus that is not available anywhere else.
- Attending Sunday Mass fulfills God's law. "Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day." Catholics keep the Sabbath holy by fulfilling our obligation to attend Mass.
- It is right and just to give thanks to the Lord our God, and the Mass is the best prayer to offer thanks. When we attend Mass on Sunday, we thank God for our many blessings, and also ask God for help in all the things that are happening in our lives.
- Jesus promises that "where two or three are gathered together in my name there am I in the midst of them." So sing and pray, knowing that Christ is among us during Mass.
- We are called to prayerfully consider what is taking place before our eyes at Mass both spiritually and physically.
- We encounter Jesus through the Word of God proclaimed, for it is He himself who speaks when the holy Scriptures are read.
- At each Mass, we witness the power of the Holy Spirit descending upon the bread and wine, and changing them into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, a truly miraculous event in which we are invited to receive this miracle.
- Every Sunday Jesus waits for us to encounter Him, knowing the gift he wants to give us is his body and blood and the promise of eternal life. Mass truly offers us a unique opportunity to recognize Jesus with us, around us and within us.
- Leave home in time to arrive at church before Mass begins. Getting to Mass early allows you to pray and better prepare yourself to encounter Jesus.
- Participate in the songs and prayers, follow the readings and listen attentively to the homily. We are not attending a performance and simply observing.
- God comes down to meet us at every Mass. So, why not dress modestly and appropriately? Formal attire is not necessary, but it should be at least respectful of such a Heavenly Banquet!
- We should attend each Mass as if it was our first and possibly even our last.

Our Parish Faith Formation Committee encourages everyone in our parish family to learn more about this specific topic.
