

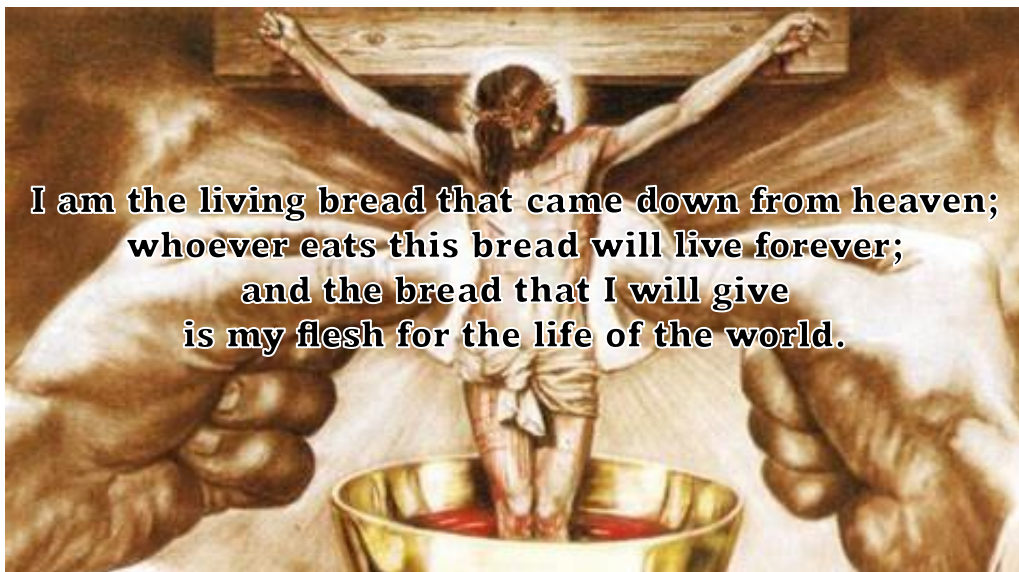

Continuing in the Bread of Life discourse, we read in sacred scripture: “Do this in memory of me. Take and eat.” These are words we have heard repeatedly at every Mass, whenever we gather for the celebration of the Eucharist. And yet in John 6:41: “The Jews murmured about [Jesus]. And in John 6:43,48,51, Jesus said to them: “Stop murmuring among yourselves ... I am the bread of life ... and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.”

Each person should wrestle with how they have responded to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, especially in times of hardship. Jesus, present in the Eucharist, is near to the broken-hearted especially in times when they wrestle.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. When have I struggled with uniting my sufferings and triumphs with Jesus? Or what have parishioners shared that offers insights into their hardships and struggles? How does the Eucharist satisfy these internal and external aches?
2. When do I choose “temporal bread”—like entertainment or pleasures—instead of Jesus the Bread of Life? Why?
3. In what ways am I being invited by Jesus to help people encounter him in his Paschal Mystery, especially in the Eucharist?

COME LOOK DEEPER INTO THE CATHOLIC FAITH

If you’ve been coming to Mass for a while, but are not Catholic, we invite you to look deeper into the Catholic faith. Come meet some faithful Catholics who love the Lord and would consider it a privilege to get to know you. The Year of Mission

Invite One Back to the Church.

- There are many reasons why Catholics have stopped attending Mass, including a significant number who lost connection with our parish during the pandemic shutdowns, and just never came back.
- There is also a very real pain for grandparents, parents, and children who have witnessed their loved ones who no longer practice the Catholic faith.
- We need to respond to the Holy Spirit's promptings to "Invite Back" those who have been away from the regular practice of the Mass. Let us pray earnestly for the Holy Spirit's guidance and fortitude to carry out this sacred mission.
- Each of us needs to invite back someone who has left the Church in a way that makes them feel seen and desired as a member of our parish family.
- The majority will only come back if personally invited. An invitation is not forceful nor aggressive, yet, by nature, it expects a response.
- It is important to invite these people back because it is a great act of love! It is also one of the simplest and most effective ways to evangelize.
- With the Invite One Back campaign, you are asked to identify a parishioner who hasn't returned to our parish since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic and to invite them back to Mass.
- Just like the Good Shepherd, we will call each of the lost sheep home as a part of the Invite One Back initiative.
- If even one person is missing from our parish, their absence matters! Every person who has ever been a parishioner at our church is a person with an immortal soul and, therefore, an infinite amount of value.
- The Church remains a spiritual home and community of people in need of God's love and mercy.
- May we embrace each soul with open arms, rejoicing as they return to the embrace of the Church and our parish community through the gift of the Eucharist.

Our Parish Faith Formation Committee encourages everyone in our parish family to learn more about this specific topic.

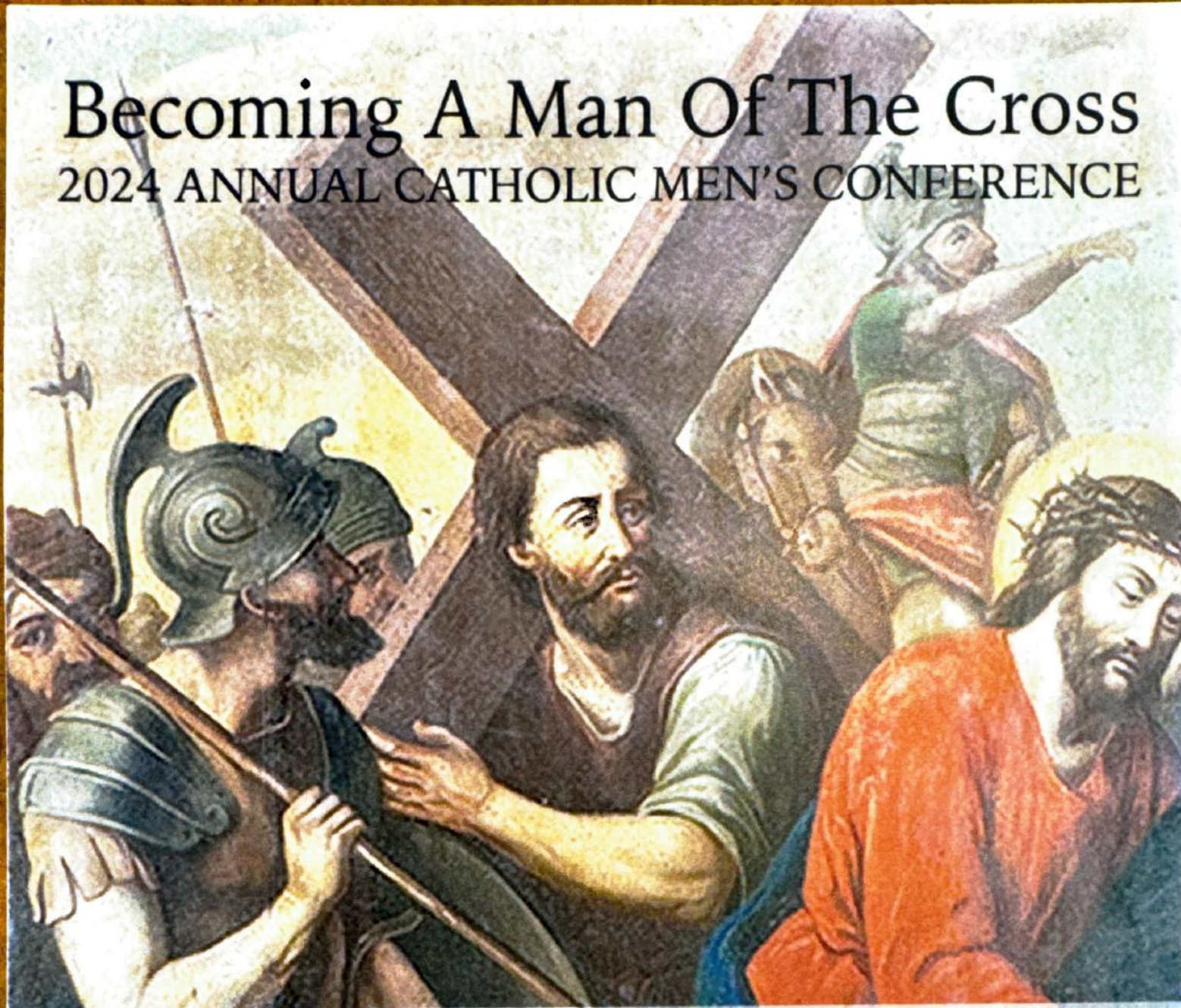

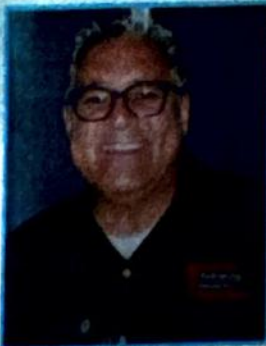
