# CATHOLIC FAITH CORNER

## A YEAR OF THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



### What Prophets had to say about the Eucharist

**Blood of the Lamb:** The highest form of Hebrew worship was sacrifice, not prayer alone, just as the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is the highest form of Catholic worship. A priest is the one who offers sacrifice. The Old Testament's sacrifice of a lamb, as opposed to any other animal, was important. The lamb did not resist, run away, or even cry out. The prophet Isaiah (53:7) had foretold that the Lamb of God would do the same: "He was oppressed, and afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth. Like a lamb that is led to slaughter or like a sheep before its shearers is silent, he opened not his mouth."

The Jewish priests, before sacrificing the lamb, always asked, "Do you love this lamb?" If the family didn't love the lamb, there would be no sacrifice. In John 21:15 Jesus three times asked Peter: "Do you love Me?" Jesus allowed Peter to replace his triple denial with a triple affirmation that he did indeed love the Sacrificed Lamb.

The family would place the lamb into the hands of the priest. When we give something to God, we place it in His hands. Jesus' last words on the Cross according to Luke 23:46 were: "Father, into Thy hands I commit My spirit!"

The priest and the head of the family then prayed together that God would accept the blood of the innocent lamb for the sins of that family for the entire year, just as the Lamb of God shed His Blood to redeem the sins of all His human family. In a similar way, the Catholic priest says, "Pray, brethren, that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God, the Almighty Father."

## 11-WEEK BIBLE STUDY: REVELATION

Perhaps no book of the bible fascinates people more than Revelation. Yet few people have studied it, especially from a Catholic perspective. *Revelation: The Kingdom Yet to Come* is an intriguing eleven-session study program that shows how the kingdom established by Christ in his Church is intimately connected with the kingdom of heaven. In this study, presenter Jeff Cavins pulls back the veil on the rich symbolism present in Revelation. Discover what the mysterious figures and images of Revelation mean and see how Revelation is more than an apocalyptic vision of the "end times."

Explore the Church's teaching on the second coming of Christ and the Last Judgment. Understand how God, the Divine Bridegroom, and the Church, his spotless bride, enter into a heavenly, holy, and mystical marriage every time we celebrate Mass.

St. John Vianney Parish will start this eleven week Bible Study beginning September 11th on Monday mornings at 9 a.m. and September 12th, Tuesday evenings at 7 p.m. Participants will meet once a week. Sign up in the Parish Office by July 28th. Fees include participant workbook.

### References to the Holy Eucharist In The Old Testament

*Passages written in scripture foreshadow  
that Jesus is the Lamb of God and  
that Bread and Wine would become  
His Body and Blood.*

## A year long focus to further educate our parish community and the Kailua community about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist



1. Bible scholars say that the Tree of Life in Genesis is a prefiguration of the Cross, and the fruit of the Tree of Life is a prefiguration of the Eucharist, the Body of Christ, which hung from the Cross.
2. Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; is said to foreshadow Christ's priesthood, who also offered bread and wine.
3. Isaac asks his father Abraham why there is a fire but no lamb for a burnt offering. Abraham responds: "God will provide himself the lamb for a burnt offering." Jesus is the "Lamb of God" offered in sacrifice for mankind. (**John 1:29**)
4. God commands Moses to say: "Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male...they shall take some of the blood and put it on the doorposts...They shall eat the flesh that night" (**Exodus 12: 5-8**). Jesus is identified with the Passover lamb, and the eating of the lamb with the eating of Jesus' body.
5. God also commands his people to eat "unleavened bread" (**Exodus 12:15**), According to Matthew and Mark, Jesus instituted the Eucharist on "the first day of Unleavened Bread" (**Matthew 26:17; Mark 14:12**).
6. God sent the Israelites the manna, or bread from heaven: Jesus is the fulfillment of the manna when he states " I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever" (**John 6: 49-51**).
7. Moses said, 'Behold the blood of the covenant which the Lord has made with you" (**Exodus 24:8**). Jesus said "This chalice which is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood" (**Luke 22:20**).
8. Moses said "You shall set the bread of the Presence on the table before me always" (**Exodus 25:30**). Jesus who is greater than the temple became the true bread of the Presence. (**Matthew 12:1-8**).
9. Todah is Hebrew for "thanksgiving. A todah sacrifice was a type of peace offering that consists of meat, bread and wine (**Lev 7:11-15; Num 15:8-10**). In the Eucharistic sacrifice, the bread and wine become the body and blood of Jesus.
10. Like a lamb that is led to the slaughter... although he had done no violence... he [made] himself an offering for sin." Jesus is, again, the "Lamb of God," who is the "righteous", and "the expiation for our sins" (**1 John 2:2**).

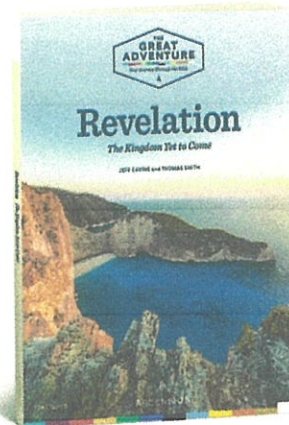

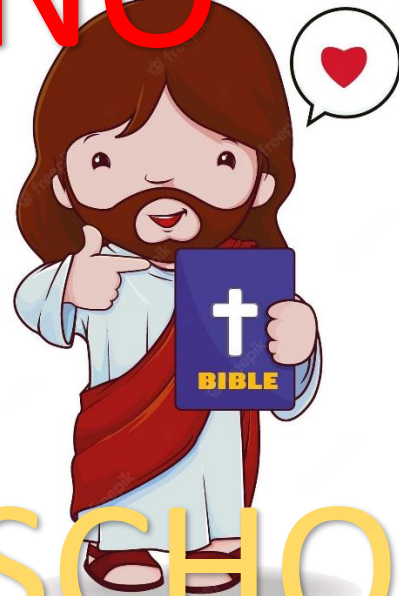
